



Becoming a Proctor in the ECVP Examination Committee

At present the ECVP examination committee is composed of 10 full members which usually commit to sitting on the committee for a period of 5 years and take responsibility for individual sections of the examination. Each year the committee has between 1 and 3 proctors who spend one year on the examination committee and are fully involved in the examination process which includes the submission and evaluation of questions and the administration of the annual examination.

Proctors get an excellent experience of the examination process, which can be beneficial in training future candidates. In addition these proctors become aware of the commitment required to be a full member, as many proctors will be asked to become full members, as the committee changes.

Any ECVP member can apply to become a proctor by submitting a letter of intent and a mini-CV to the secretariat at ECVP Office [ecvpjf@liverpool.ac.uk].

Please note, the selection of proctors is made by the examination committee and is approved by the ECVP Council in February each year. The criteria for selection is based on the need to address deficiencies in certain areas of expertise within the existing examination committee. CVs will be held for a period of five years. Recent diplomats of the ECVP may apply as proctors after a period of 3 years from the time of examination.
