Job Description:

Summary of Duties and Responsibilities:

The Department of Veterinary Pathology, College of Veterinary Medicine at Iowa State University is seeking qualified applicants for a 12-month, full-time, tenured or tenure-eligible, or renewable term clinical-track position in veterinary anatomic pathology. Applications are being accepted at the Assistant or Associate Professor level. The department has key responsibilities in diagnostic pathology services, research and teaching, and provides diagnostic services to the Lloyd Veterinary Medical Center and practicing veterinarians across the country.

At the rank of tenured or tenure-eligible Assistant or Associate Professor, the position will consist of 30-40% diagnostic anatomic pathology services, 20-30% collaborative or independent research, 20-30% teaching professional DVM and graduate student courses, and 5% institutional service. At the term appointment rank of Clinical Assistant or Clinical Associate Professor, the position will consist of 75-85% diagnostic anatomic pathology service including teaching professional DVM students, graduate students and residents; 10-20% scholarship, and 5% institutional service. Actual percentages are flexible depending on the candidate's expertise and departmental needs. Current departmental research interests include animal models of human disease, infectious disease, respiratory disease, host-pathogen interactions, parasitic diseases, neurodegenerative disease, oncology, and immunopathology.

The successful candidate will be expected to develop an active scholarly program. For appointment in the tenure-track, the selected individual should have a strong record of training and experience in diagnostic pathology, experience with teaching, hypothesis driven research, and prior grant writing experience. Collaborative or independent research resulting in peer-reviewed publications and external grant submissions is expected. For an individual in the term-track, scholarship could include advancing the discipline of anatomic pathology through creation and dissemination of new knowledge, or participating in collaborative research.

Required Minimum Qualifications:

- DVM or equivalent degree
- Completion of requirements to sit Phase II of the ACVP examination or the ECVP examination in Anatomic Pathology

In addition, positions at the following ranks will also require:

- Graduate degree in a discipline relevant to pathology
- Record of training and experience in diagnostic anatomic pathology, teaching and research

Associate Professor

- ACVP or ECVP board certification in Anatomic Pathology
- Graduate degree in a discipline relevant to pathology
- Documented record of productive scholarship; solid publication record in peer-reviewed journals
- A record of successful didactic teaching and training pathology residents

Clinical Term Assistant Professor

- ACVP or ECVP board certification in Anatomic Pathology

Clinical Term Associate Professor

- ACVP or ECVP board certification in Anatomic Pathology
- A record of successful didactic teaching and training pathology residents
- At least 5 years of experience in diagnostic anatomic pathology

Preferred Qualifications:

- PhD or equivalent degree in a discipline relevant to pathology
- ACVP or ECVP board certification in Anatomic Pathology
- DVM or equivalent degree from an AVMA accredited university
- Experience in diagnostic pathology
- Experience in collaborative or independent research
- Teaching experience
- Board Certification – ACVP or ECVP
