

Assistant, Associate, or Full Professor of Veterinary Anatomic Pathologist, non-tenure track, Department of Pathobiology, School of Veterinary Medicine, St. George's University, Grenada, West Indies

The Department of Pathobiology is seeking qualified applicants for a full-time, non-tenure track position in veterinary anatomic pathology. Applications are being accepted at the Assistant, Associate, or Full Professor level. Department faculty members have responsibilities in research, teaching, and diagnostic pathology services.

The successful candidate will be expected to advise and mentor DVM, MSc and PhD students, and actively engage in independent and collaborative research. Research areas of emphasis at SGU-SVM include: vector-borne disease, zoonotic disease and public health, aquatic animal health, parasitology, and clinical sciences. Experience and interest in immunopathology/infectious disease research is highly desired. The candidate will provide instruction for the Immunology course to veterinary students, and possibly other courses in the curriculum.

The candidate is expected to work closely with other faculty in providing support of the necropsy/biopsy laboratory which provides service to the Grenada SPCA, SGU Small Animal Clinic, Junior Surgery Laboratory, SGU Large Animal Resource Facility, and local veterinary practitioners. Dedication to outstanding service and client communication is highly desired.

Minimum requirements include a DVM or equivalent. A PhD or ACVP/ECVP board eligibility or certification is preferred. Desired qualifications include a record of research scholarship, excellence in didactic lecture and excellent written and interpersonal skills.

Starting salary and appointment will be commensurate with professional and academic credentials and experience.
