National or international board certification as veterinary pathology specialist is required. Several years of experience in raising third-party resources from national and international funding programs are expected.

According to domestic legal guidelines (TAppV) the successful applicant will be responsible for teaching veterinary students in the field of pathology.

Candidates are expected to demonstrate their potential for an outstanding academic career with an excellent record in research, teaching and, where appropriate, clinical service. As communication with students, staff, industry and stakeholder will require knowledge of spoken and written German, it is germane for the successful candidate to demonstrate the sincere willingness to become proficient in the German language.
