Veterinary Anatomic Pathologist Up to £52,500 p/a (Inclusive of MFS) Permanent, Full Time

The Animal Health Trust is a large UK-based veterinary charity dedicated to promoting animal welfare through improved understanding of diseases in cats, dogs and horses. Situated in a beautiful location just 4 miles from Newmarket in Suffolk, the AHT has multi-disciplinary small animal and equine referral clinics, veterinary diagnostic laboratories including pathology facilities and a number of associated research groups (including bacteriology, epidemiology, genetics, immunology, molecular oncology, pathology and virology).

We are seeking an anatomic pathologist to participate in both diagnostic service work and research across a predominantly equine and companion animal caseload. The work focuses on post mortem evaluations, surgical biopsies, and immunohistochemistry interpretation. There are opportunities to participate in a variety of collaborations in multidisciplinary research; examples include, but are not limited to, the fields of equine infectious disease, which is supported by the Equine Thoroughbred Industry and companion animal oncology and internal medicine. The ability to take primary responsibility for cases, work within deadlines and have a pro-active approach to problem solving is essential. Previous experience of equine anatomic pathology is preferred but not essential.

Compensation is dependent on experience and qualifications, and includes a competitive salary and benefits (e.g. USS pension scheme, 27 days annual leave plus Bank holidays, health plan and a comprehensive employee assistance scheme). Time off diagnostic work is allocated for research and continued professional development (CPD) is actively encouraged and promoted within the institute and a generous allowance offered.

Board certification (ACVP, ECVP) or FRCPath is requirement for this senior role. However board eligible candidates that have completed a recognised veterinary pathology residency program will also be considered on a lower starting salary to reflect this. Current membership with the RCVS (MRCVS) is an essential requirement.
