The **University of Melbourne** seeks an enthusiastic, motivated and team-focused Lecturer in veterinary pathology to join our team in the Department of Veterinary Biosciences at the Melbourne Veterinary School. The Melbourne Veterinary School's Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) is AVMA, RCVS and VSAAC accredited and the school is ranked globally at 15<sup>th</sup> among veterinary professional schools. The University of Melbourne is Australia's leading university and is consistently ranked in the top 30 universities globally, being recognised for its leading and innovative research and teaching. The Lecturer in Veterinary Pathology will primarily be responsible for the theoretical and practical instruction in veterinary anatomic pathology of graduate students enrolled in the first, second, third and fourth years of the Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) course and undergraduate students enrolled in the Veterinary Bioscience Major in the third year of the Bachelor of Science (BSc) degree.

The incumbent will also contribute to the provision of diagnostic services in anatomic pathology by performing necropsies on a range of domestic, wild and exotic animal species and providing histological interpretations of necropsy and biopsy specimens submitted by clinicians of The University of Melbourne Veterinary Hospital and by external clients including Racing Victoria Ltd.

The successful applicant is also expected to develop skills in planning, developing and implementing research, establishing collaborations with researchers in other sections and supervising graduate students enrolled in research and coursework degrees in veterinary pathology.

The Lecturer will be located at the Werribee campus of the Faculty of Veterinary and Agricultural Science but will be expected to teach veterinary students from time to time at the Parkville campus.
