#### **Description (12)**

Lesion: Hepatocyes - ballooning degeneration – cell swelling with compression of sinusoids, cytoplasmic clearing, nuclei not severely displaced (5)
Distribution: Centrilobular and midzonal hepatocytes and multifocal - (normal hepatocytes in periportal regions) (5)
Heptocytes contain brown- green granular material, also in Kupffer cells and periportal macrophages. (2)

### Morphologic Diagnosis(es) (5)

Severe centrilobular to midzonal hepatocellular ballooning degeneration (4) Intracellular cholestasis (1)

Special stains of use Glygogen – PAS Lipid - Oil-red-O

#### Possible cause (3)

Glycogen accumulation due to excess corticosteroids - steroid hepatopathy

Excess exogenous corticosteroid use Functional adrenal gland tumor

## Clinical pathology:

Marked increase glucocorticoid induced alkaline phosphatase

Additional information: 5yr old castrated male Labrador Retreiver.

Gross findings: Liver was pale.
